We wanted to make this evening very special for Mr. Mangione. During the planning stages, an idea was propose that we increase the size of our 52 member horn line. A call went out to former members and their friends and friends friends to join our ranks for spectacular perforthis mance.

Larry Kerchner arranged the three songs to play for the tribute early in the year and we used them all season in our regular show. Larry interviewed many horn players and the result was we ended up with a total of 87 horns for the tribute.

After we found out how many horns we would have, Larry said three songs aren't enough to pay tribute to this legendary performer, so we learned a fourth song. The songs we put together for the evening were "Echano", Bellavia", Land Of Make Believe" and Hill Where The Lord Hides."

The larger horn line posed a problem though. The corps could no longer fit on the stage. So we positioned everyone on the floor.

We ran through the show a couple of times and waited for the guest of honor to come into the room. Chuck entered with his family and friends to the cheers of around 2,300 people. He and his guests took up over 60 seats in the first two rows.

Before we played, there was a film documentary of all the times that Chuck was a commentator on the DCI Championship broadcasts. This film was introduced in person by DCI and radio personality, Steve Rondonero.

Then it was our turn to play. What a sound. The power of the corps was deafening. We blew their faces off.

After we were done, Jeff Kievit, famous trumpet player from the Muchachos and successful recording artist and performer presented

Fast forward to 1971. I had been writing for, and flying down from Boston to teach the Cabs for a couple of years and the Muchachos for a year, when I had the opportunity to write my first original for the Muchachos (pre-"Espiritú del Toro" and "Pictures of Spain"), so I dusted it off and re-wrote my "El Matador" piece, this time for G-F horns with rotary valves (a big deal)! Not only did I use it for their opener, but over the years, I've used bits and pieces of it with the Muchachos, Cabs, and Cabs Alumni. In fact, the "Chorale" and the beginning of "Jazzmerelda" are both from "El Matador." The one thing I had never done was to write a fullblown version for the Cabs Alumni and 3-VALVED HORNS!!!

Somebody Up There Likes Us!


